the membership list, announced Mr. Takemura recently, who is now working on the ESS Reorganization program.

The membership registration for the school year 1952 will be conducted before the end of this month for the first time in the three-year ESS history. Mr. Takemura pointed out two major reasons for conducting this measure:

- (1) it will become necessary when the now-unofficially-decided "two-year-one-year-at-one-time" payment system is officially put into effect.
- (2) it will serve to stabilize (even to reduce) the already-swollen number of members in preparation of letting in newcomers in April.

Mr. Takemura, however, did not say whether he wanted some ceiling put to the number of members.

Some time ago, he was reportedly considering limiting the membership to one hundred.
